

# Share Stage Reflection Questions

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By reflecting on the **share** stage using the 5Rs—Representation, Relationships, Reflexivity, Responsibility, and Resources—you will focus on making sure your strategies to share the results of your research resonate with community partners and voices. These reflections will help you strengthen your knowledge sharing and increase the likelihood that action is taken as a result. Use the following reflection questions to guide your thinking through this stage.

## Representation

- Who are we sharing findings with, and how are we adapting materials to fit their needs, preferences, and contexts?
- Are there any communities, audiences, or perspectives we have missed or not fully included in this phase of sharing?

## Relationships

- How do our sharing strategies support, strengthen, or build on relationships developed during the project?
- How are we recognizing and celebrating the contributions of community partners in public and meaningful ways?

## Reflexivity

- How are our own values, assumptions, or positions shaping decisions about what is included, emphasized, or left out?
- What feedback or insights from community partners could help us improve our materials, messages, or presentations?

## Responsibility

- Have we had clear conversations about authorship and credit, and are we honoring everyone's contributions?
- Are we sharing findings in ways that protect privacy and follow ethical agreements made earlier in the project?

## Resources

- Do we have the time, funding, and tools to share findings widely, accessibly, and in the ways we promised?
- How are we helping partners use these findings beyond the life of the project or after funding ends?
