10 minutes	<p>Research Questions + Findings Review</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Review research questions that guided our work on this project. • Review findings that were shared and discussed in Meeting 12.
25 minutes	<p>Questions for the Panel Activity</p> <p>In small groups, we will brainstorm questions related to our research questions and findings and then prioritize questions for panelists.</p> <p>For the first round, each group will spend time focusing on brainstorming panelist questions for two out of four categories. In each group, you'll have 14 minutes total for brainstorming across the two categories.</p> <p>Then, we'll move to round two, where you switch to the two categories the other group was brainstorming and spend 10 minutes total prioritizing questions for both categories.</p>

	<p style="text-align: center;">Policy Process</p> <p>Youth were most likely to be engaged in policy advocacy and least likely to be engaged in policy implementation.</p> <p>Policy implementation is a stage that would benefit from increased authentic youth engagement to ensure policies reach their intended goals.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">ROUND ONE: Panel Questions Brainstorm</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> How can we get more young people involved in policy implementation? What would it take? Do you feel like there have been reasons or opportunities for you to engage in policy implementation? If not, what would you like to see be changed? What are the barriers to authentic youth engagement in implementation? Do you feel like there have been reasons or opportunities for you to engage in policy implementation? If not, what would you like to see be changed? Especially alumni youth, if they choose to remain involved
